Budget Update

The House recently passed our revised 2nd year budget. Here are some of the highlights: **Education**

\$12.217 billion - 57% of the total General Fund budget of \$22.22 billion for 2016-17.

- \$8.8 billion in K-12 funding
- 3.5-4% increase in teacher pay.
- Continued funding towards the the implementation of the NC Digital Learning Plan

- Increases again the appropriations for Textbook and Digital Resources adding another \$11.7 million
- Provided scholarships for students working to fill hard to staff positions in our public schools
- Expand Special Education Scholarships for children of active duty military
- Targeted \$25 million in funding towards literacy coaches in low performing schools

Health and Human Services

\$5.06 billion - 23% of spending

 Provides \$30 million to implement the recommendations of the Governor's Task Force on Mental Health



Friends from Piedmont Health Services (PHS) stopped by the office to discuss some important health issues and funding concerns.

• Expanded slots in the NC Community Alternatives Program for Disabled Adults.

• \$8.5 million to local health depts Justice and Public Safety

\$2.5 billion - 11% of total spending

- Provides for step increases for State Highway Patrol, magistrates and clerks
- Salary increases for correctional officers

Agriculture, Natural and Environmental Resources

\$492 million - 2% of total spending

- Restores funding to the tobacco and farmland preservation funds
- Allows 31 counties to eliminate the emissions testing requirements

Transportation

State Highway Fund - \$2.0 billion State Highway Trust Fund - \$1.37 billion

- Eliminates tolling on NC ferry system
- Increases funding for highway maintenance by \$12.9 million
- Appropriates \$6 million to advance DMV modernization initiatives specifically call center and local office wait times
- Revises DOT bidding process to increase transparency



HR professionals from Alamance County businesses stopped by to talk about......HB2 it was a very good meeting.

General Gov't

\$379 million -1.7% of total spending

- Provided funds to make the NC Building Code registry fully accessible and searchable on line
- Increased funding for domestic violence shelter grants by \$45,242
- Added 3 new positions for fraud investigations at the Dept of Insurance
- Added one position to the Local Gov't Commission to help local governments at risk of financial failure

Budget Recap

The House passed our perfect ⁽²⁾ budget over to the Senate. The Senate is currently working out their budget priorities and will send it back to the House. We will probably vote "not to concur" and then a Conference Committee will be appointed to iron out the differences. When that is accomplished it will return to both bodies for a final vote. If the budget passes both the full House and Senate it will be sent on to the Governor's desk for Gov. McCrory's approval and signature.

Other Legislation

- SB71 Coal Ash Management Update Review and upgrade of our Coal Ash Management Plan. Includes a broader fix to potential fresh water needs around existing coal ash ponds. Also seeks to expand the safe reuse of coal ash to reduce the amount to be stored. It will also bring the Coal Ash Commission into conformity with a recent state Supreme Court ruling. This bill faces a likely veto by Gov. McCrory
- HB813 Results First Framework This is my bill that seeks to create in NC government an "evidencebased policy making" program based upon the Pew Charitable Trust and MacArthur Foundation model. The bill passed the House and is awaiting its' turn in the Senate. This is a bi-partisan idea that we need here in NC.
